### **Denver GLBT Commission Recruiting Applicants**

Looking for an opportunity to become more involved with the community and contribute to a stronger and more inclusive Denver?

The Denver Gay Lesbian Bisexual and Transgender (GLBT) Commission is actively recruiting new members to fill terms that will be open in May 2009. We will be filling at least 7 vacancies on the 21-member commission.

The **mission** of the Denver GLBT Commission is to enhance the social, economic and political quality of life in Denver by assisting gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender people in the attainment of political equality and full opportunity by empowering the Community through coalition building, gathering and disseminating information, and other activities.

The **purpose** of the GLBT Commission is to provide the Mayor with a more complete understanding of and access to the GLBT community in Denver for the purpose of creating better representation and government services.

The GLBT Commission has three platform/working groups for 2009: healthy communities, inclusive business, youth and family. We work on a diverse range of issues related to these and other topics. Activities organized by the GLBT Commission have included: a town hall on economic development, focus groups on health, and a forum on ballot issues.

The GLBT Commission is one of eight commissions that operate in conjunction with the Denver Agency for Human Rights and Community Relations to represent and address the priorities of specific populations and communities within Denver. A representative from the GLBT Commission serves on the Human Rights and Community Relations Advisory Board, along with representatives from each of the 8 Commissions and 4 at-large members.

The Denver GLBT Commission is dedicated to reflecting the broadest possible representation from within our diverse community, including neighborhoods, age, gender expression, sexual orientation, people of color, (dis)ability, hiv/aids status, and other identities.
