Sample Ballot for the State Primary and Special Municipal Elections

August 8, 2000

City and County of Denver

The State Primary and Special Municipal Elections will be held on Tuesday, August 8, 2000.

To vote for candidates in this election, one must be affiliated with either the **Democratic** or **Republican Party**. There is 1 ballot question on which any registered voter may vote regardless as to the voter's affiliation status. If a voter is registered as unaffiliated, as a U.S. Pacifist, or as a Concerns for People, the voter can declare his/her affiliation with either the Democratic or Republican Party when one goes to vote. The voter is subsequently allowed to vote for the candidates of his/her newly declared party. The deadline for changing from Democrat to Republican, or vice versa, is July 10, 2000.

If a voter is registered with one of the state's minority parties, such as the Green Party, the voter can only vote on the ballot issue question. For minority party members to vote for any candidates, he/she would have had to changed his/her affiliation to Democrat or Republican on or prior to July 10, 2000. U.S. Pacifist and Concerns of People are considered minority organizations and voters affiliated with these two organizations are treated the same as unaffiliated voters and can declare affiliation with the Democrats or Republicans and vote for the appropriate candidates.

There are 20 different Democratic ballot styles and 20 different Republican ballot styles. The reason for this number is the result of how the 3 senate contests boundaries overlap with the 10 house districts. Each voter must vote for the appropriate candidates which match the specific districts in which the voter lives.

In all contests for this election the voter must vote for only one candidate or selection for each contest or ballot issue.

The following ballot question will appear on all ballot styles:

CABLE TELEVISION NON-EXCLUSIVE FRANCHISE GRANT 1A

Shall the City and County of Denver grant a non-exclusive franchise to WideOpenWest Colorado, L.L.C. to construct, operate, and maintain a competitive cable television system in the public rights-of-way (as defined in the franchise) for a term of ten years (to be extended for up to five years if certain financing and construction requirements are met), which franchise allows for the provision of digital and analog cable television service and high-speed internet access; an emergency alert system; customer service standards for quality and reliability; free service to the public schools and libraries; enforcement; and other related public benefits and establishes the terms and conditions for the construction, operation and maintenance of the cable system and the use of the public rights-of-way?
