### **Denver Public Works Begins Broadway Rehabilitation Project**

*Improvements Start on Broadway between Welton Street and Park Avenue West*

**DENVER, CO — Thursday, March 17, 2011** — Denver Public Works will start rehabilitation work on Broadway between Welton Street and Park Ave West on Friday, March 18, 2011, as part of the Better Denver Bond Program approved by voters in 2007.

The Broadway reconstruction project will rehabilitate 4,900 linear feet of curb, gutter, and sidewalk, and will replace 24,000 square yards of existing asphalt road with concrete pavement. The traffic signals on Broadway at California, Stout and Champa Streets will also be replaced as part of this project. Additional upgrades include bulb-out crosswalks, which reduce crossing distance in the street, installation of new crosswalk buttons and signs, and improvements to the curb ramps.

During construction vehicles will be able to access Broadway and side streets; however, it will be in a constricted capacity. Travel lanes will be reduced to two lanes in the southbound direction and one lane northbound throughout the duration of the project. Access to businesses will be maintained during construction. Construction of this segment of Broadway is anticipated to be complete by late summer 2011.
