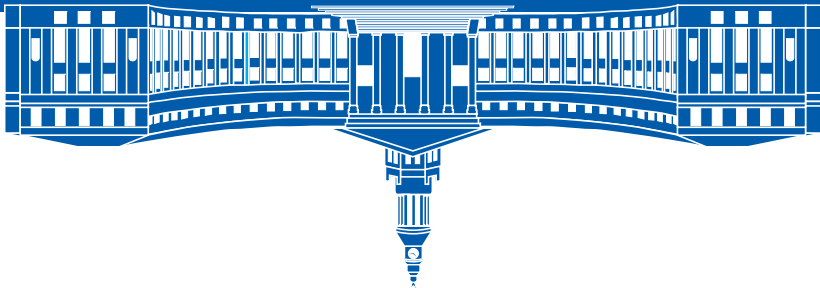

1. The new city snow removal plan calls for plowing a lane on residential streets simultaneously with snow removal on arterial and collector streets when snowfall will reach 12 inches. Private contractors are also on standby to assist if necessary. Have you noticed any improvement in the quality of the city's snow removal efforts on residential streets?
Yes 64% **No 36%**
2. What other snow removal steps should Denver take? (check any that apply)
 - a. Purchase more heavy equipment for snow removal. **17%**
 - b. Plow alleys. **5%**
 - c. Urge plow drivers to avoid pushing snow back onto already shoveled sidewalks and driveways. **61%**
 - d. Have the city website use GPS to show citizens the location of plows in real time. **10%**
 - e. None. The problem has been satisfactorily addressed. **21%**
3. Greenprint Denver's draft Climate Action Plan included a recommendation to charge residents proportionately based on the amount of garbage they set out for collection. Do you support this proposal, or not?
Yes 18% **No 82%**
4. The Mayor has told Ruby Hill neighbors he will explore the feasibility of raising millions of dollars to underground electric transmission lines in all Denver parks. Are you willing to pay a tax or fee to bury transmission lines in parks across the city?
Yes 15% **No 85%**
5. The Mayor's Director of Human Services has announced an intention to use city tax money to build 200 units of housing for the homeless without voter approval. Should Denver get into the business of building homeless housing with city tax money?
Yes 16% **No 84%**
6. Denver's Board of Environmental Health voted to let restaurant owners decide whether to allow customers to bring dogs to outdoor dining areas, subject to some restrictions. Do you support allowing customers to bring their dogs onto patios at cafes and coffee shops, or not?
Yes 37% **No 63%**
7. The Colorado History Museum must relocate from Broadway and 14th to accommodate the state Supreme Court Building expansion. It had asked Denver to allow construction of this state-financed project in the Civic Center area so it could remain close to other museums. While plans to locate inside Civic Center Park have now been abandoned, do you believe the Museum should still be near the Civic Center area?
Yes 59% **No 41%**
8. Expressing security concerns about electronic voting machines, the Colorado Secretary of State has decertified many of Denver's machines. Using the alternative – paper ballots – could be accomplished either through a mandatory all-mail ballot (if the state changes the law to allow partisan elections to be conducted by an all-mail ballot) or through a combination of absentee voting and paper ballots at precincts. Should voters be allowed the option of going to a polling place to cast a paper ballot?
Yes 86% **No 14%**
9. The Denver zoning code has long allowed any person to apply for a rezoning of any property, regardless of whether the applicant owns the property. Last year the city council passed a new law requiring that applicants own at least 50% of the land to be rezoned. Should neighbors be able to initiate zoning changes that affect your property, even if you do not support the changes?
Yes 8% **No 92%**
10. A proposed ballot initiative would require mandatory arrest of people and seizure of their automobile if they are driving with false identification. Do you support this proposal, or not*?
** The initiative as submitted was changed to require the impoundment of vehicles driven by unlicensed drivers, including illegal immigrants, and did not mention mandatory arrest.*
Yes 85% **No 15%**
11. Current city law requires disclosure of gifts to individual officers and employees of \$50 or more. Denver's Board of Ethics recommended disclosure of gifts over \$250 given to the city as an entity, including the donor's name. The city administration instead issued an executive order covering gifts of \$2,500 or more, with a provision that donors could request anonymity if they wished. Do you believe the disclosure level should be set lower than \$2,500 and require identification of the donor?
Yes 85% **No 15%**
12. Recreate 68, a group wanting to protest at the Democratic National Convention, objected to Denver's proposed park and parade permit regulations. Based on First Amendment concerns, the group stated "expressive activities should be put in a different category from, and given preference in the lottery over commercial activities" (such as A Taste of Colorado) for permits. Do you agree that protest groups should be given preference, or not?
Yes 13% **No 87%**
13. The playground at Bear Creek Park, south of the Bear Valley Shopping Center, is scheduled for renovation. The sombrero, which many individuals think of as an icon in this park, may or may not be retained as the playground is updated. (It is currently used as a children's slide.) Should Bear Creek Park continue to include a sombrero?
Yes 67% **No 33%**
14. Jeanne, as my city councilwoman, you could help me most by:
Most frequently mentioned problems were graffiti, illegal immigration, unkempt neighborhoods, and tax burden.
