## Remember to Treecycle!



From January 3 through January 13, Solid Waste Management and Denver Recycles will be collecting and recycling old Christmas trees from residential homes. The trees will be ground into mulch which will be available for free to Denver residents in the spring.

You must remove all tinsel and decorations from your tree. No artificial or flocked trees, tree stands or trees in plastic bags.  
Set your tree out on your trash collection day.

Residents with dumpster collection service should place their trees out for collection on Tuesday, January 3 or Monday, January 9.

Be sure your tree is set out by 7 a.m. and has at least 4 feet clearance from any containers, bags, dumpsters or other obstacles.

**DO NOT** place trees in dumpsters.

## Council Reviews Comcast Cable Service

The biennial Comcast performance evaluation is coming up on Wednesday, January 18th at 6:30 p.m. in City Council chambers. The public is encouraged to attend and share comments.

The Comcast franchise allows the City to hold sessions in which residents can express their opinion about cable service. Both customers and non-customers are invited, and Comcast will also have regional vice present Rich Jennings on hand to make a brief presentation and answer any questions Council may have. Denver Channel 8 will broadcast the session live.

## Proposed Hillcrest Communications Tower

The Denver Department of Safety will be erecting communications towers in Denver in order to facilitate communication between all public safety departments in Denver and the surrounding municipalities. One proposed site is the Denver Water land on Hillcrest Drive. Councilwoman Lehmann and the Department of Safety have called a public meeting to discuss the proposed tower on January 26<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. The location is to be decided. ## Library Policy Changes

On January 2, 2006, the Denver Public Library will make the following changes to its circulation policies in response to customer feedback.

### Hold Shelf Changes:

Every Denver Public Library location will keep customer-requested holds on the hold shelf for seven calendar days to improve access for customer pickup.

### Renewal Changes:

- Videocassettes, DVDs and music CDs will all continue to check out for one week, but they will now be renewable for an additional week unless another customer has placed a hold for an item.
- Books and audio books remain three week checkouts with three additional three-week renewal periods unless another customer has placed a hold for an item.

Books, DVDs and CDs designated by the Library as Featured Titles will still not be renewable, and circulating magazines will remain non-renewable.

## Help Your Community Bloom in 2006!



Don't miss out on your chance to order FREE vegetable seeds and transplants from Denver Urban Gardens. Applications are now available to Denver residents who meet low to moderate-income guidelines. Applications can be picked up at recreation centers, churches and senior centers throughout Denver. The application deadline is **Monday, February 6, 2006**. Seed and plant varieties include: tomato, pepper, onion, broccoli, squash, lettuce, corn, carrots, herbs and much more! Seeds are delivered to centers in March and transplants in May. To locate the distribution center nearest you, call Denver Urban Gardens (DUG) at 303-292-9900.

Garden plots are also available in more than 60 community gardens throughout the Denver area. Garden space is limited and early sign-up is encouraged.

The Free Seeds and Transplants Program is funded by a grant from the City of Denver Housing and Neighborhood Development Services, and is operated by DUG, a nonprofit organization. DUG was formed over 20 years ago to help urban neighborhoods create community gardens and neighborhood-scale parks. To date, DUG has helped build and support over 60 community gardens and open space parks throughout the Denver-metro area. DUG sites provide gardeners with space to grow pesticide-free produce, improve neighborhood aesthetics and provide residents with visible examples of neighborhood achievement.
