**Res. 69, Series of 2009, A resolution approving the Mayor's Appointments to the Denver Commission for People with Disabilities. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)**

**Res. 70, Series of 2009, A resolution approving the Mayor's Reappointments and Appointments to the Denver Women's Commission. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)**

**Bills for Introduction – Held in Committee (Series of 2009)**

**C.B. 306, Series of 2009, A bill for an ordinance amending Division 10 of Article VI of Chapter 54, Denver Revised Municipal Code, concerning the regulation of parades. (SAFETY)**

Amends the parade ordinance to lengthen the time for the Manager of Safety to respond in writing to a permit received within 30 days of the event from 24 hours to three business days; revise the designation of historical usage for purposes of determining preference for special events from 5 years to 2 years, adding language requiring applicants to work with the Denver Police Department on the required staging area, and clarifying the submission process. The Committee approved filing this bill at its meeting on 5-6-09.

**C.B. 334, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance approving an Amended 2009 Budget and Operating Plan for the Cherry Creek North Business Improvement District No. 1. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)

**C.B. 335, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance authorizing expenditures in the Economic Opportunity Special Revenue Fund for the "Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Case Management, Employment, and Training FY09-10" program. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)

**C.B. 336, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance authorizing the Mayor and other proper officials to enter into a grant agreement with the United States of America for a "Community Development Block Grant FY2009" program, a "HOME FY2009" program, and a "HOPWA FY2009" program, and the funding therefor. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)

**C.B. 337, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance approving a proposed Second Amendatory Agreement between the City and County of Denver and Catholic Charities and Community Services of the Archdiocese of Denver, Inc. to provide tenant-based rental assistance and security deposits for homeless and low-income individuals. (NEIGHBORHOOD, COMMUNITY & BUSINESS REVITALIZATION)

**C.B. 338, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance approving a proposed Amendment to Contract between the City and County of Denver and Highway Technologies, Inc. for pavement marking, removal and installation services. (PUBLIC WORKS)

**C.B. 339, Series of 2009**, A bill for an ordinance approving a proposed Equipment Lease Purchase Agreement between the City and County of Denver and Wells Fargo Brokerage Services, LLC for the financing for the purchase of dump trucks from Transwest Truck. (PUBLIC WORKS)
