A BILL

For an ordinance making a rescission of cash and budget balance to close out the "Emergency Management Performance FY06" grant in the General Government Special Revenue Fund, and a transfer of cash from the General Government Special Revenue Fund to the "Emergency Management Project Fund" in the Public Safety Special Revenue Fund.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. From appropriations heretofore made from the General Government Special Revenue Fund listed or indicated in the following tabulation there is hereby RESCINDED the amount listed or indicated in such tabulation under the heading "Amount Rescinded" and transferred to the General Government Special Revenue Fund:
