A BILL

For an ordinance amending section 39-121 of the Revised Municipal Code changing various fees and charges for permits or admission for boating, golf, Buffalo Bill Museum, athletic fields, parks, recreation centers and classes, Genesee Experiential Center, Skatepark, Chief Hosa campground and lodge, and adult softball and tournaments, in the Department of Parks and Recreation.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER:

Section 1. That subsection 1 (Boating fees-All locations) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language and numbers stricken and adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

41 Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised
42 Municipal Code shall be amended by adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

b. *Special rates and conditions:* The manager of parks and recreation shall designate not less than 7 days in each calendar year during which no admission will be charged to residents of the city, and the manager may establish rates or conditions for groups or special parties and may charge additional rates for groups and special parties from outside the city.

Section 4. That subsection 9 (Reservation and permit fees) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

39-121. (9) Reservation and permit fees. Athletic facilities for the purposes of this section shall include, but not be limited to fields, courts, other sport facilities and equipment, building and stands accessory thereto.

- a. Organized leagues or teams may permit athletic facilities for a season(s) on dates specified by the manager of the department of parks and recreation. After permits are issued to organized leagues or teams, individuals and groups shall be allowed to permit athletic facilities based on availability.
- b. The manager may establish periods when athletic facilities shall be unavailable for reservation.
- c. Priorities for reserving athletic facilities by organized leagues or teams.
 - 1. Leagues or teams serving the larger percentage of Denver youth under the age of eighteen (18) shall receive first priority in the permitting or reserving of athletic facilities.
 - 2. Leagues or teams serving the larger percentage of Denver residents shall receive second priority in the permitting or reserving of athletic facilities.
 - 3. Teams in organized leagues shall register by:
 - (a) Filing a parks and recreation athletic program roster of each team containing such information as the manager may deem necessary;
 - (b) Filing a waiver of liability on a form approved by the manager and executed by each player on the team or, for players under the age of eighteen (18), a waiver and indemnity agreement executed by a parent or guardian. At the option of the team/league and with the approval of risk management, an

appropriate insurance policy with the city named an additional insured may be substituted for the waiver agreements required above; and

(c) Filing an official league playing schedule.

4. Organized youth leagues and teams shall report to the manager any players dropped or added to any roster.

d. Major fields and grass/skin fields:

1. The manager shall designate and categorize athletic fields subject to permitting as major fields, grass/skin fields, or synthetic fields.

In addition to all other fees for tournaments, there shall be a refundable key deposit of \$295.00, a damage deposit of ~~\$310.00~~ 315.00 for one (1) to four (4) facilities fields, and a damage deposit of ~~\$640.00~~ 620.00 for five (5) or more facilities fields, which deposits shall be refundable if keys are returned and the facilities fields are left in a clean and undamaged condition. There is a base rental of ~~\$15.00~~ 15.25 a set per day, and a staff supervision (required) charge of ~~\$20.00~~ 25.00 per hour for tournaments held at major fields.

h. The manager shall promulgate rules and regulations to implement this section 39-121(9) and to establish procedure and time frames for the reservation of athletic facilities.

i. Failure to comply with the provisions of this subsection or the department's rules and regulations may result in the imposition of penalties including but not limited to the revocation of permits, the denial of the right to reserve athletic facilities, or in a lowering of the team's or league's priority.

Section 5. That subsection 10 (Parks permit fee schedule) of section 121 (Schedule for Use of Facilities) of Article IV (Fees and Charges) of Chapter 39 (Parks and Recreation) of the Revised Municipal Code shall be amended by deleting the language and numbers stricken and adding the language and numbers underlined, as follows:

39-121. (10) Parks permit fee schedule:
