RULES AND REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE DISTANCE RESTRICTION BETWEEN HOTEL AND RESTAURANT LIQUOR LICENSES AND CERTAIN PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES AND THE DISTANCE RESTRICTION BETWEEN BREWPUB LICENSES AND CERTAIN PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES

- 1. This Rule and Regulation will supersede and replace the Rules and Regulations Pertaining to the Distance Restrictions between Hotel and Restaurant Liquor Licenses and Certain Public Schools and Colleges adopted by the Department of Excise and Licenses in September of 1999. The September, 1999 Rule and Regulation is revoked.**
- 2. No application for the issuance of any liquor license specified in C.R.S. Section 12-47-309(1) shall be received or acted upon if the building in which the liquor is to be sold is located within five hundred feet of any public, or parochial, or nonpublic school meeting the compulsory education laws of the State of Colorado. The exceptions contained in C.R.S. Section 12-47-313(1) (d) shall apply.**
- 3. Except for public, parochial and nonpublic schools that meet the conditions of paragraph number four (4) of this Rule and Regulation, no application for the issuance of any liquor license specified in C.R.S. Section 12-47-309(1), except hotel and restaurant liquor and brewpub license applications, shall be received or acted upon if the building in which the liquor is sold is to be located within five hundred feet of the principal campus of any college, university, or seminary. In the case of a hotel and restaurant liquor license or a brewpub license, the distance restriction established by C.R.S. Section 12-47-313(1)(d) shall not apply to buildings located near or on the campus of colleges, universities, seminaries, or other institutions not meeting the compulsory education laws of the State of Colorado.**
- 4. In the case of a hotel and restaurant liquor license or brewpub liquor license, the distance restriction established by C.R.S. Section 12-47-313(1) (d) shall not apply to any public, parochial or nonpublic school located on the principal campus of any college, university, seminary, or other institutions not meeting the compulsory education laws of the State of Colorado, if a hotel and restaurant liquor license or brewpub liquor license has been issued for any premises located on the campus of the college, university, seminary, or other institution not meeting the compulsory education laws of the State of Colorado.**
