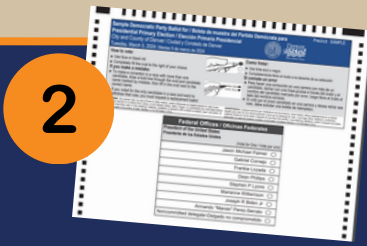




Ballot content is certified and finalized



The ballot is designed, translated, and proofed for accuracy



Ballot design is sent to print



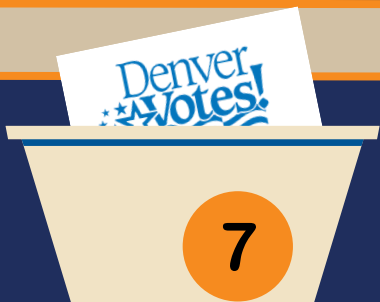
The Denver Elections Division conducts a Public Logic & Accuracy Test to ensure our equipment is functioning properly



Ballots are mailed out 22 days before Election Day



Drop boxes checked daily by bipartisan teams. Ballots are returned to Denver Elections Division for processing



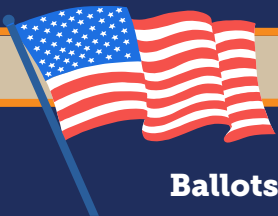
Ballot envelopes are date- and-time stamped at this point



Bipartisan teams verify signature discrepancies



Ballots are scanned and imprinted with a number later used in auditing

Ballots are counted and reported

First unofficial results are posted at 7 p.m. on Election Day

Official results are not posted until ALL BALLOTS ARE COUNTED and then sent to the Secretary of State for public posting. In the weeks following, a risk-limiting audit is performed to ensure accuracy, and a bipartisan canvass board then certify the results
