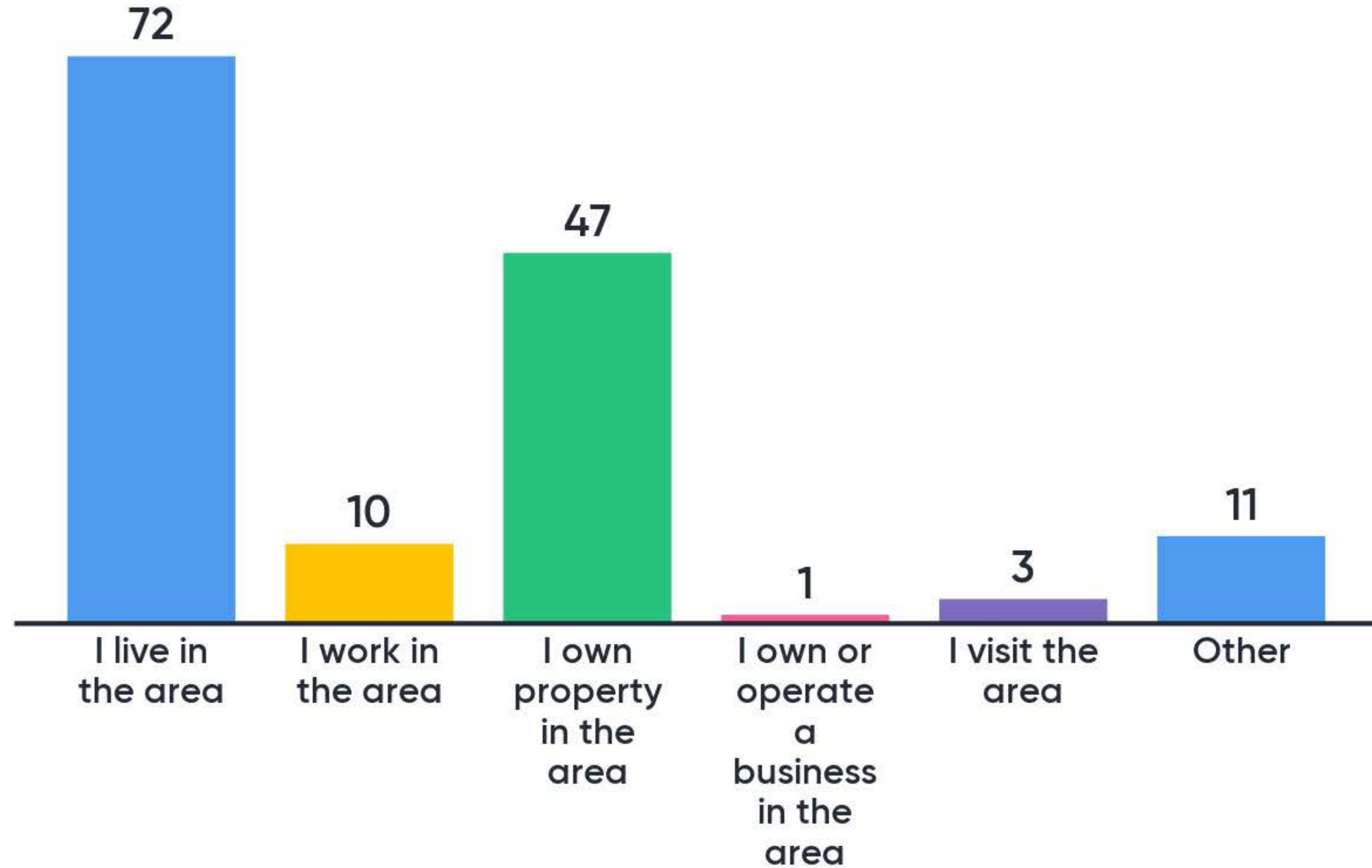
What neighborhood do you live in?



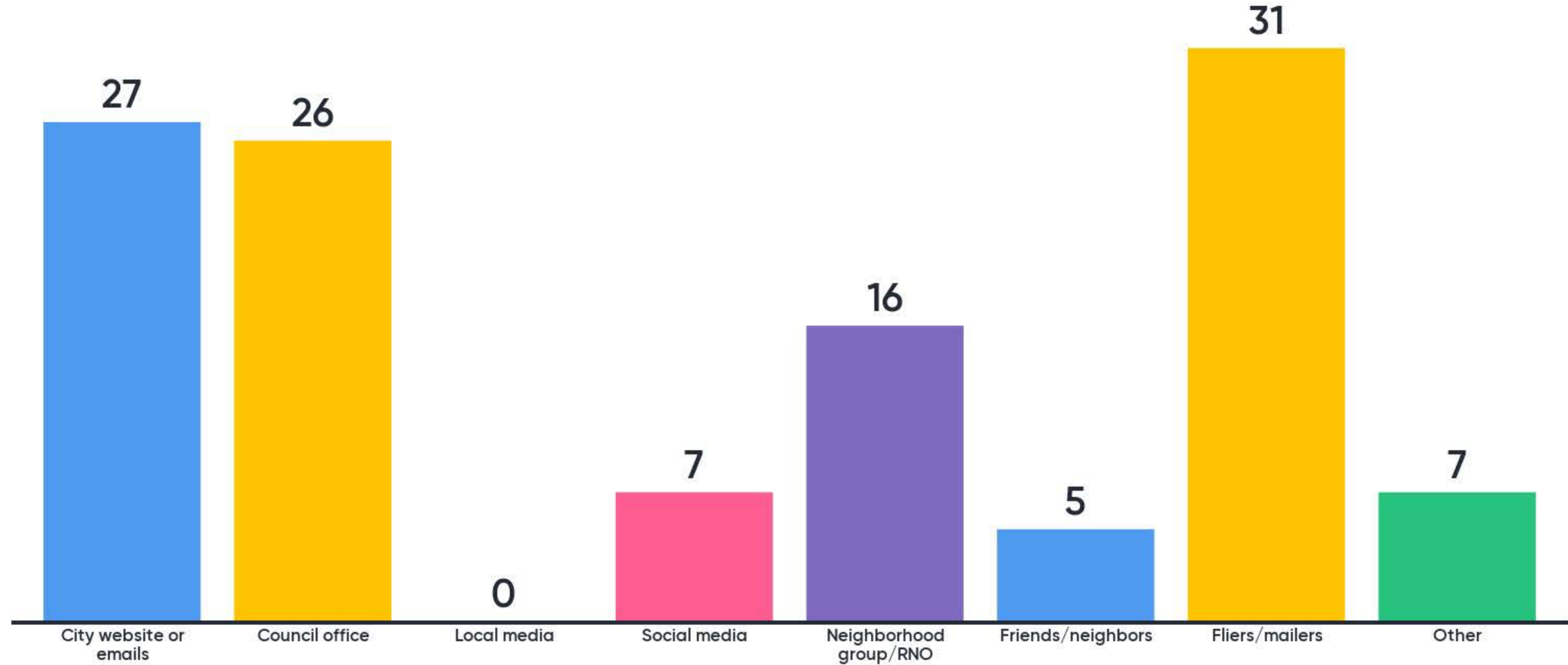

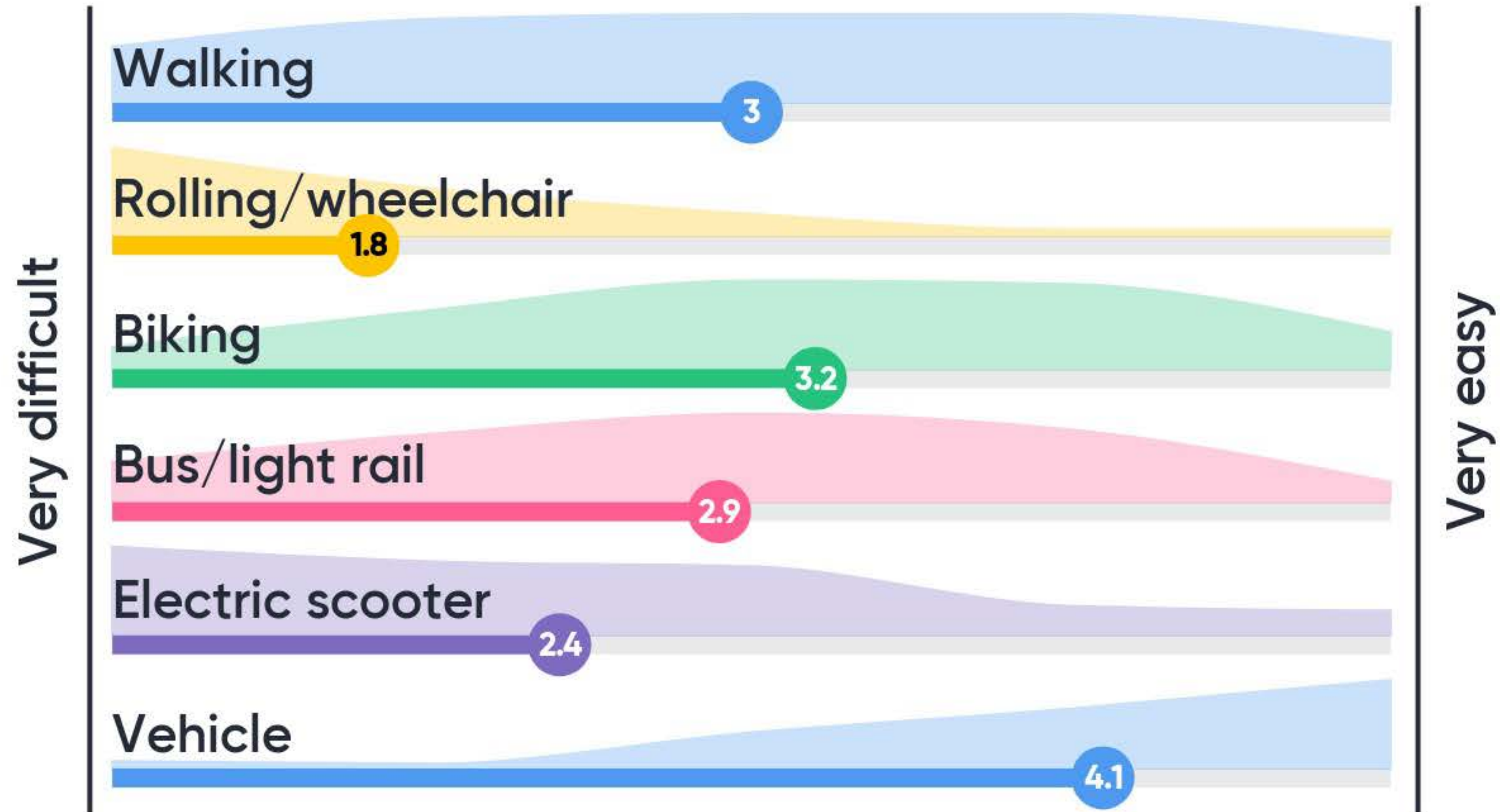

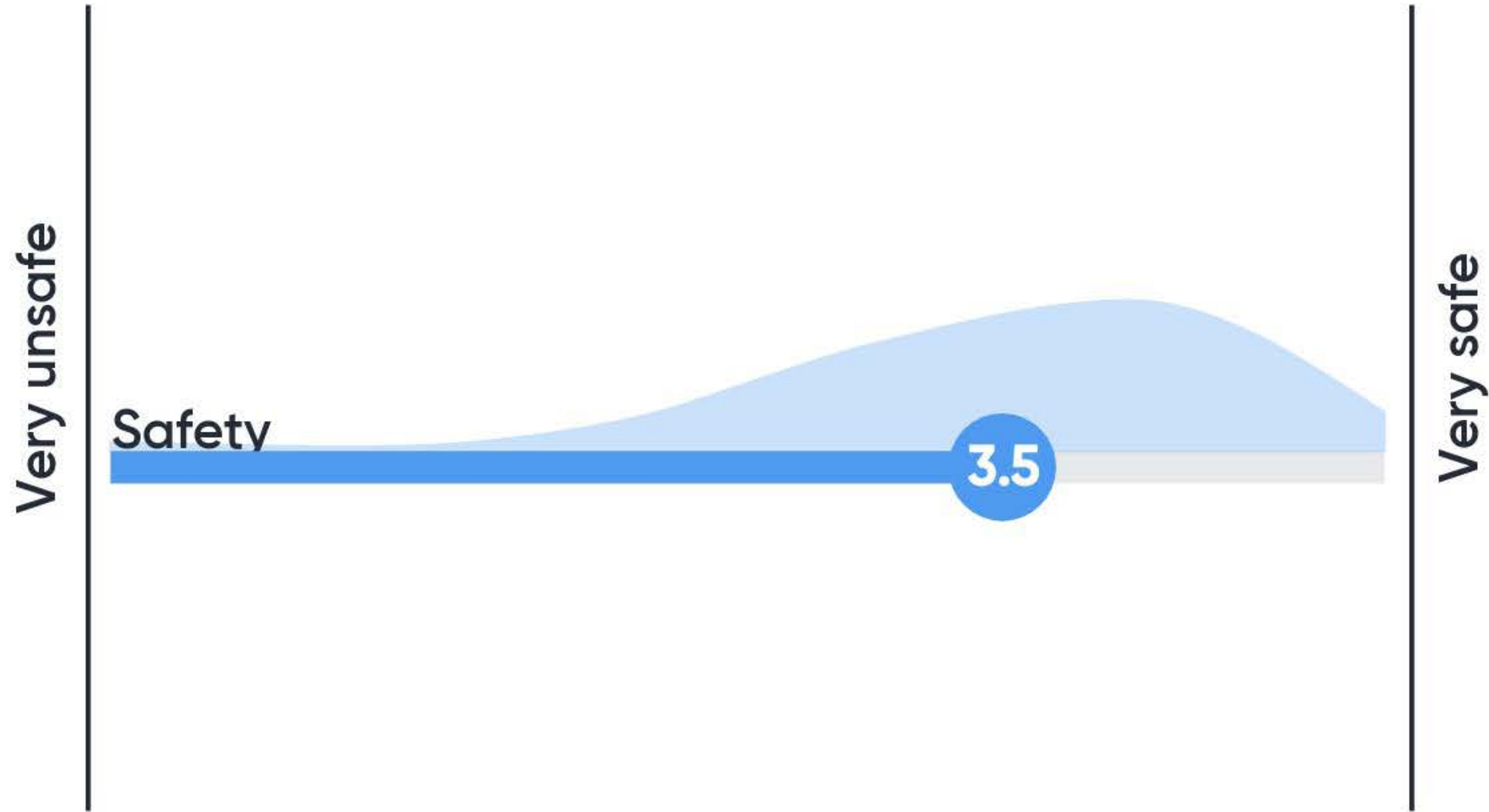

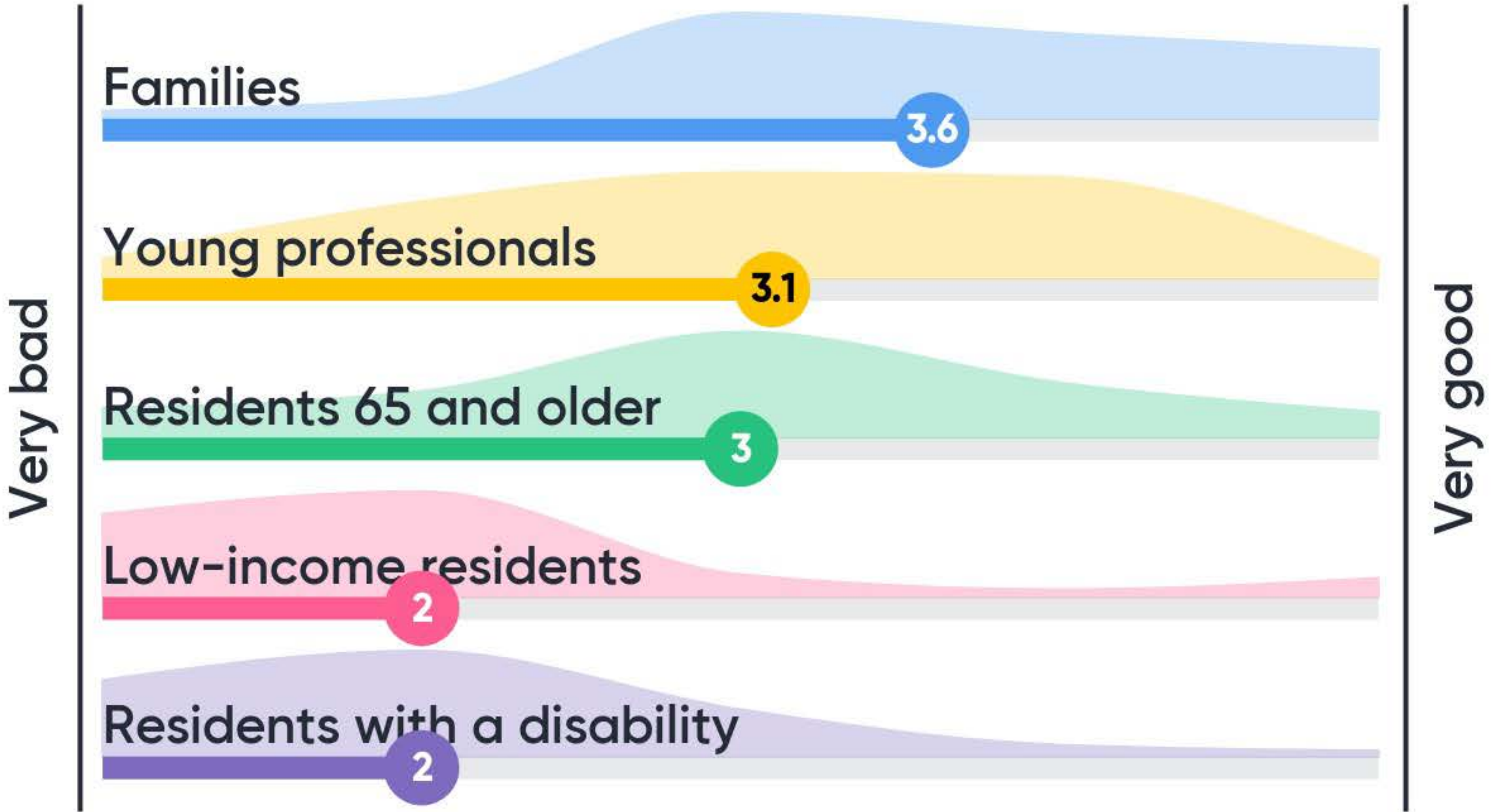
How easy is moving around Near Southeast using each mode of transportation?



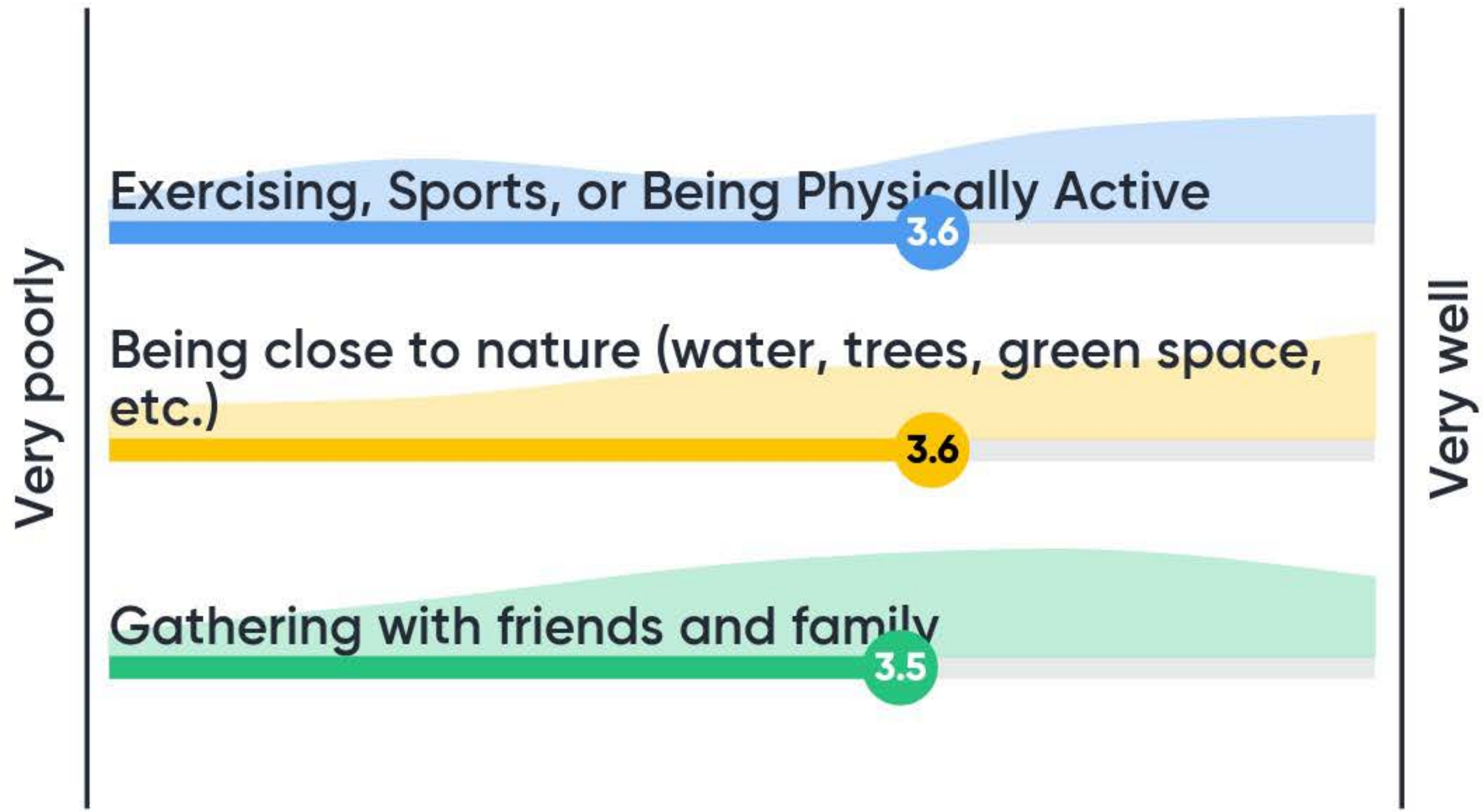
How safe or unsafe do you feel in Near Southeast?



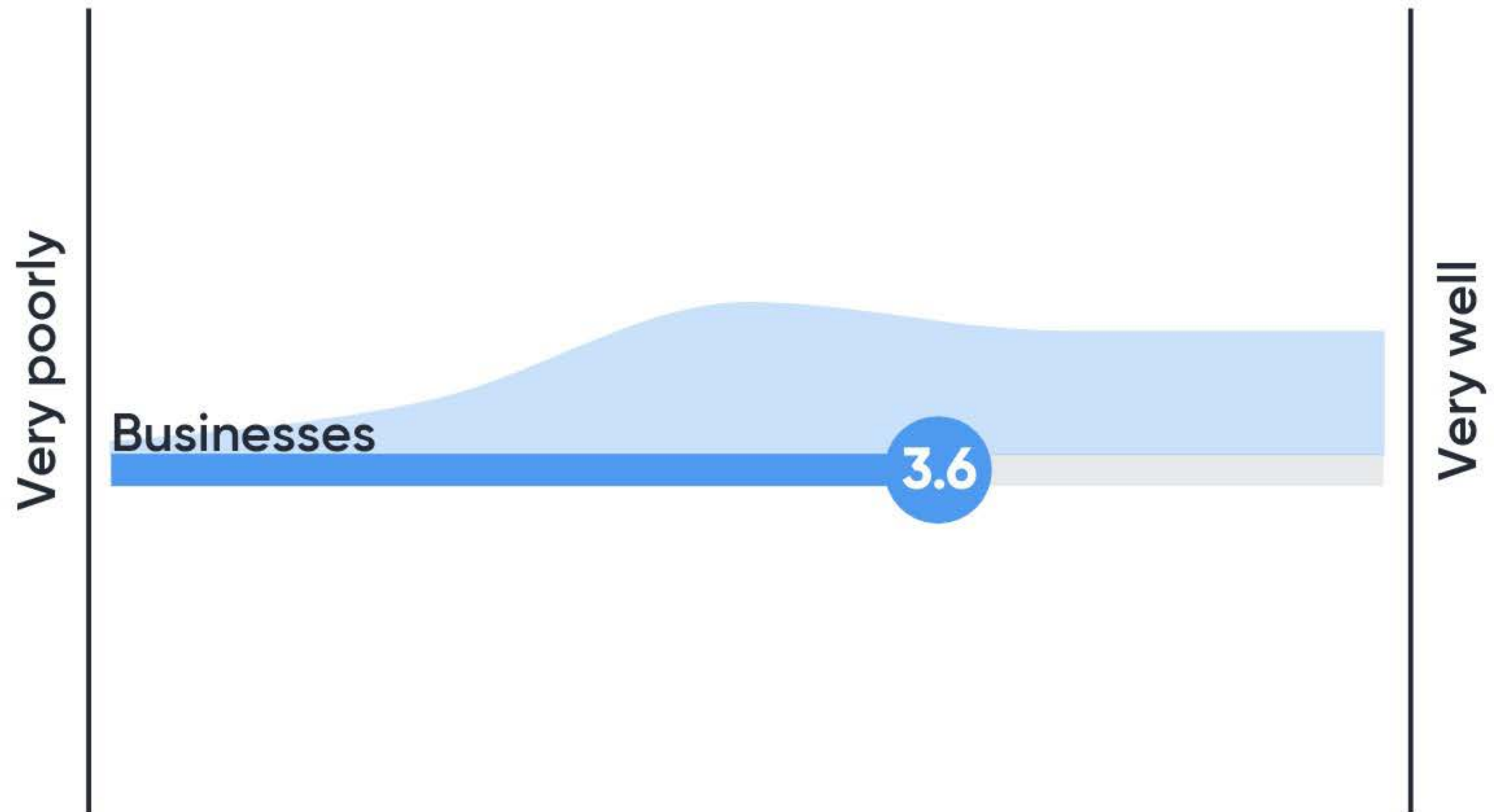
How good are the housing options for each of the following groups in Near Southeast?



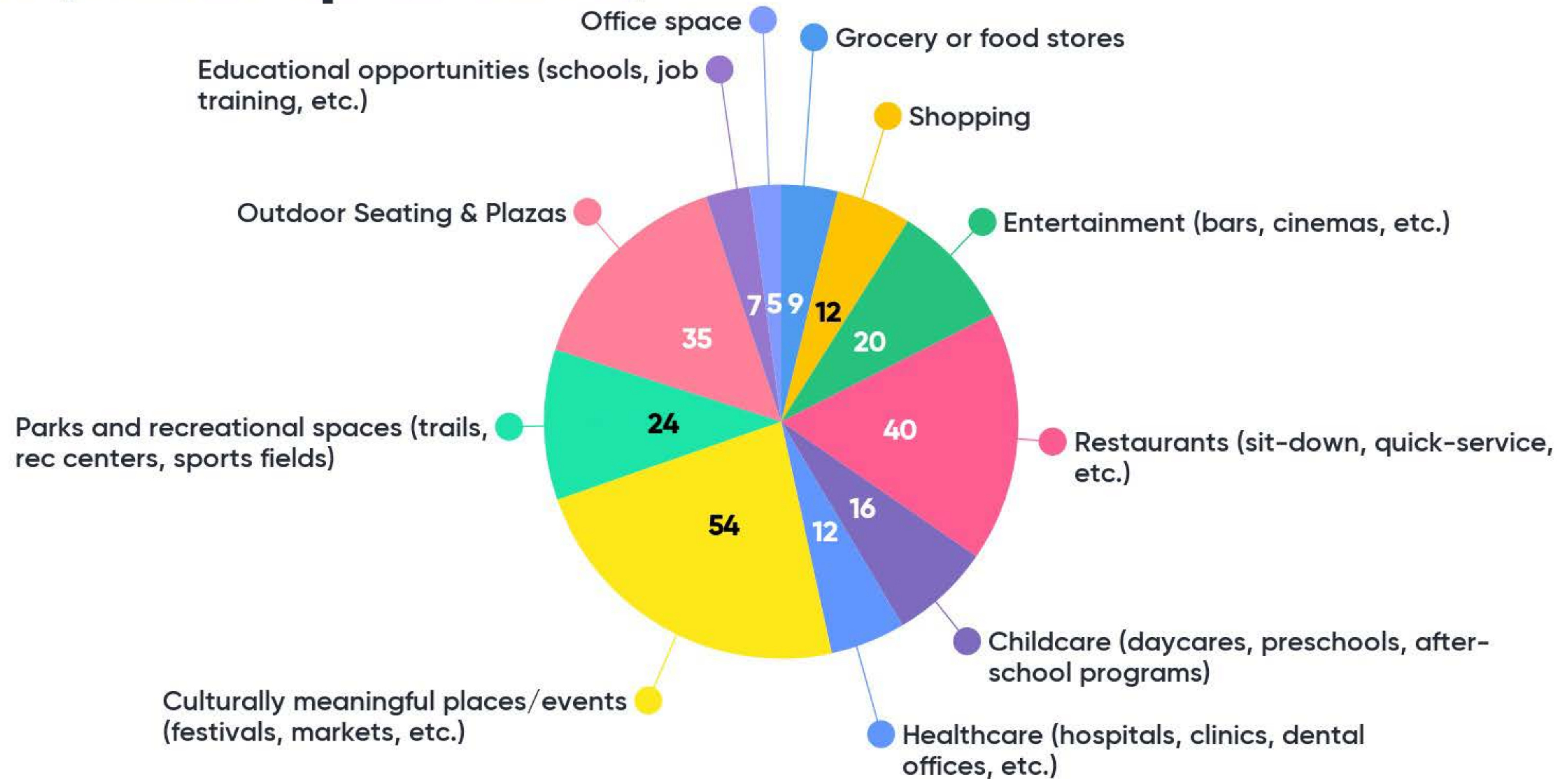
How well do the parks and recreation centers in Near Southeast meet your needs for the following activities and amenities?



How well do the businesses in Near Southeast meet your needs?

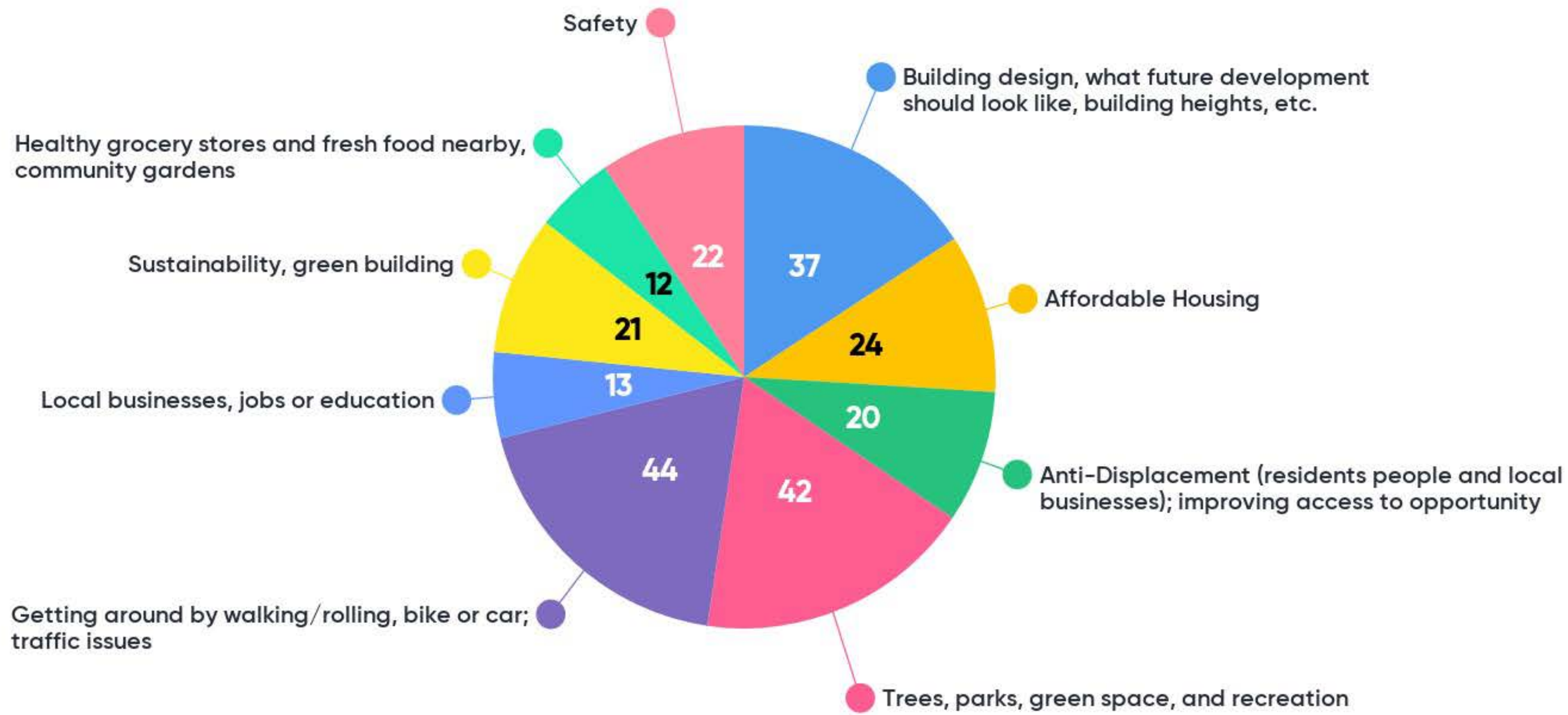

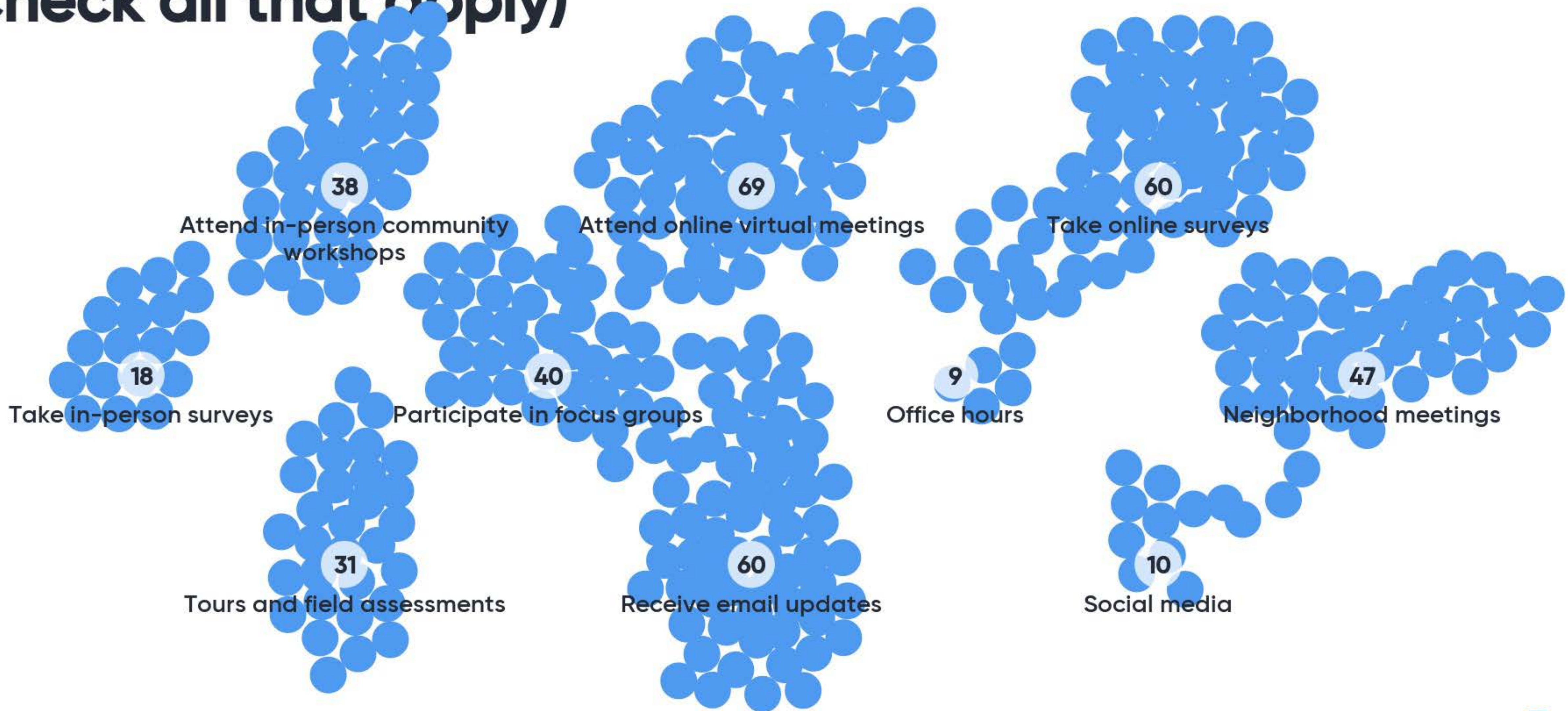

What would make successful engagement?

Incorporate comments into plan

Consistent engagement and communication from the team

High community involvement

Get more people involved

What would make successful engagement?

Transparent and continual communication

Meet with Four Square Mile

Continuing engagement on regular basis.

Problems/issues are solved.

Hearing feedback from others and explanations of decisions

get people to focus on future not current complaints

Lots of updates on progress

People feel that they had an opportunity to participate, be heard and engage at the level they want to contribute

Records of all interactions. Receipts

What would make successful engagement?

Continue to engage the community

Being able to give input

all corners of neighborhoods reached

Make it fun. Communicate often. Give updates.

Promoting greater awareness and integration of diverse populations.

Really listening to the feedback provided by the community members, and truly honoring it.

Present the plan before decisions are made. Allow discussion before it's too late.

The city making a reasonable effort to open up a dialogue with the impacted neighborhoods. Then that dialogue actually being implemented or, at minimum, discussed.

Making sure there is strong participation from the people who actually live here. Not leave it to city council.

What would make successful engagement?

Voice of customer taken into consideration

Understanding priorities
Frequent updates

Wide demographic representation

Inclusivity

Representative participation, many opportunities to provide input

A wide variety of people giving input. Check-ins at key points of planning.
Acknowledgement/feedback on input, even if not incorporated in recommendations.

continue reaching out to RNO's. keep people, neighbors informed. see progression throughout the process.

Regular ongoing communications that continue with the promised themes

Giving priority to neighborhoods over developers

What would make successful engagement?

Group Meeting

Create a city position to exclusively support RNOs and help them communicate information to members

Strong neighborhood community feel. Great neighborhood schools, walkable! Build on diversity & inclusion.

Inclusive democritization of the process - to include all stakeholders of the neighborhoods - not just those who agree with major city plans.

Work closely with Glendale!

Inclusivity

Focus groups for each neighborhood. Council listens to neighborhood groups.

The implementation of some of the changes that are identified by the various methods of getting viewpoints on what needs to change

What would make successful engagement?

We would like to see an integration of developers and occupants- ensuring developers are paying for their community impact

Meaningful planning with community input

Community outreach in multiple languages, perhaps using multiple media platforms (print, radio, social media, etc.)

Continued engagement

Ongoing follow up and engagement

prioritize traffic calming

All parties are heard...no one person takes over the microphone.

Having diverse leadership to represent the communities impacted by the decisions that are made. Implementing the decisions people make.

Results! If you are going to go through the motions, hopefully something will come of efforts!

What would make successful engagement?

Listen to feedback

Emphasize evidence-based decision making

Feeling known reduces crime and increases peoples sense of empowerment

show us real action items

I am concerned about gentrification, so I want to make sure affordable housing comes into fruition.

Considering each of the 5 or 6 neighborhoods and their needs/issues/opportunities into consideration

Survey
