




## 41st + fox next steps study community open house | july 9, 2019





## summary

The City and County of Denver Public Works and North Denver Cornerstone Collaborative hosted a community open house on July 9, 2019 at the 41<sup>st</sup> and Fox Station. Approximately 40 people attended this introductory meeting that included local residents, property holders, area business owners and transit riders at the station. Attendees discussed the study, provided input on key areas, and shared thoughts on future connections and transportation improvements.

Based on conversations with community members and written comments, several common themes emerged:

- Community members expressed a need for more area connections for all modes of transportation. Attendees highlighted the need to consider safety for people walking and bicycling when designing facilities.
- Community members would like to see improvements to 44<sup>th</sup> Avenue bridge that better accommodate bicycle and pedestrian movement within Globeville and to and from the station.
- Community members would like to see improvements to 38<sup>th</sup> Avenue underpass that better facilitates walking, bicycling, and driving.
- There are mixed thoughts on the course of future development regarding density, and many community members expressed a desire to see existing residential areas maintained.
- Community members had mixed feelings about new roadway connections to the north and west of the neighborhood. If there are additional new connections, community members would like them to feature high quality bike and pedestrian amenities.
